DELRAY BEACH, FL (September 17, 2025) On August 28, local business executives and philanthropic leaders came together for An Evening to Build, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Palm Beach County's Executive Build 2025 Kick-off Party. Guests enjoyed high-level networking, curated bites and cocktails, and lively music while connecting with the heart of Habitat's mission.

An Evening to Build was hosted by Blaine Minton at the stunning Minton Manor and historic Clint Moore Estate in Delray Beach, one of the last remaining Georgian Colonial-style homes in South Palm Beach County. With the help of the Delray Beach Preservation Trust, the home was designated as a protected local historic site. Extensive renovations led by local experts restored the 6,177-square-foot home while adding thoughtful modern updates. Guests were able to enjoy the historic charm that defines this iconic property, beautifully preserved and maintained for future generations by current owner, Blaine Minton. Gathering at this incredible home set the stage for a season dedicated to building strength, stability, and opportunity through affordable homeownership.

"It's an honor to open my home to support Habitat for Humanity's mission," said Blaine Minton. "Bringing our community together in this way reminds us of the impact we can make when we build not just homes, but opportunities for families to thrive."

The program showcased several pivotal moments, beginning with the introduction of Executive Build 2025 Co-Chairs, Robyn Raphael-Dynan and Jason Dynan, alongside Adam and Rachel Handfinger. Attendees enjoyed an inspiring keynote address from Robert Sechan, the CEO & Co-Founder of NewEdge Wealth and Co-Managing Partner at NewEdge Capital Group. Host Blaine Minton shared heartfelt reflections on his experiences with the historic Clint Moore Estate. The program was rounded out by Christina, a future Habitat homeowner and member of

an Executive Build partner family, who shared her aspirations for creating a brighter future for her children.

The night celebrated the power of leadership and philanthropy coming together to make a lasting community impact. Through their support, families like Christina's can achieve the dream of safe, affordable homeownership.

Executive Build is an annual fundraising and team-building event that brings together local executives, business leaders, and changemakers to raise construction tools and build hope for Habitat families.
