Habitat for Humanity of Greater Palm Beach County, City of Boynton Beach, and Villa's Construction Complete Home Renovation for Local Veteran

Boynton Beach, FL (November 6, 2025) — In honor of Veterans Day, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Palm Beach County (Habitat GPBC) celebrates the completion of a full home renovation for a local U.S. Air Force veteran in Boynton Beach. The project, completed in partnership with the City of Boynton Beach and Villa's Construction, reflects Habitat's ongoing commitment to serving veterans through its housing programs.

Through funding and support from the City of Boynton Beach and Villa's Construction, this long and extensive renovation transformed a hurricane-damaged residence into a safe and resilient home. The work included installation of a new roof, windows, and doors, significant structural repairs, and new appliances.

To mark the project's completion, a private ceremony took place, welcoming the veteran back into his home and recognizing the collaboration that made this effort possible. Attendees included representatives from Habitat, the City of Boynton Beach, Villa's Construction, the veteran and his family, and Angela Cruz, Boynton Beach District 1 Commissioner.

"We are proud to support this project and honor the service of our local veterans," said RJ Ramirez, Manager, Community Improvement for the City of Boynton Beach. "Providing funding to help renovate this home demonstrates our commitment to ensuring that those who have served our country can live safely and with dignity in our community. This renovation is part of Habitat for Humanity of Greater Palm Beach County's Veterans Build program, an ongoing effort dedicated to helping veterans and their families maintain safe, accessible, and comfortable homes. Through critical repairs and home upgrades, the program helps veterans protect their financial investment and take pride in homeownership.
